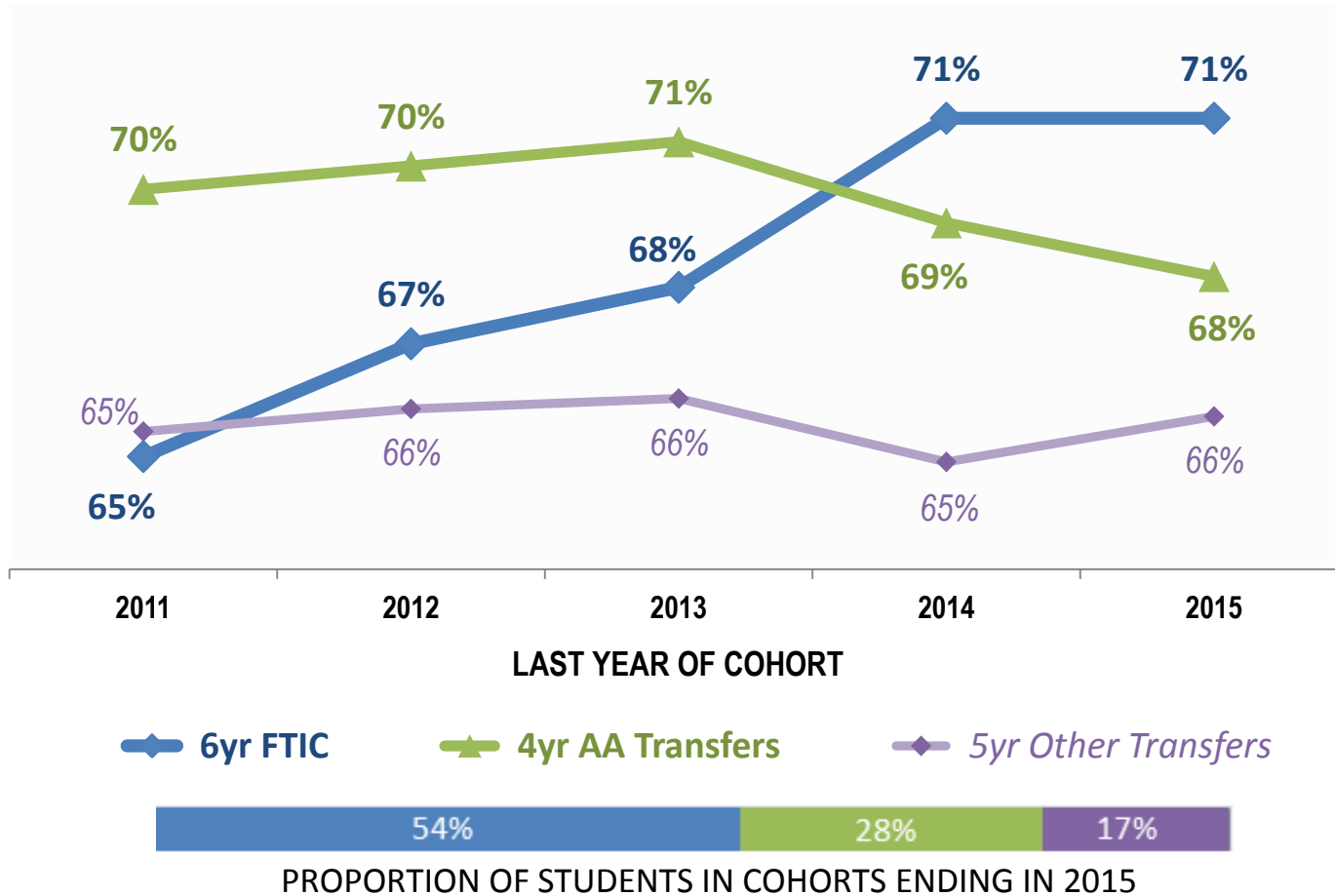

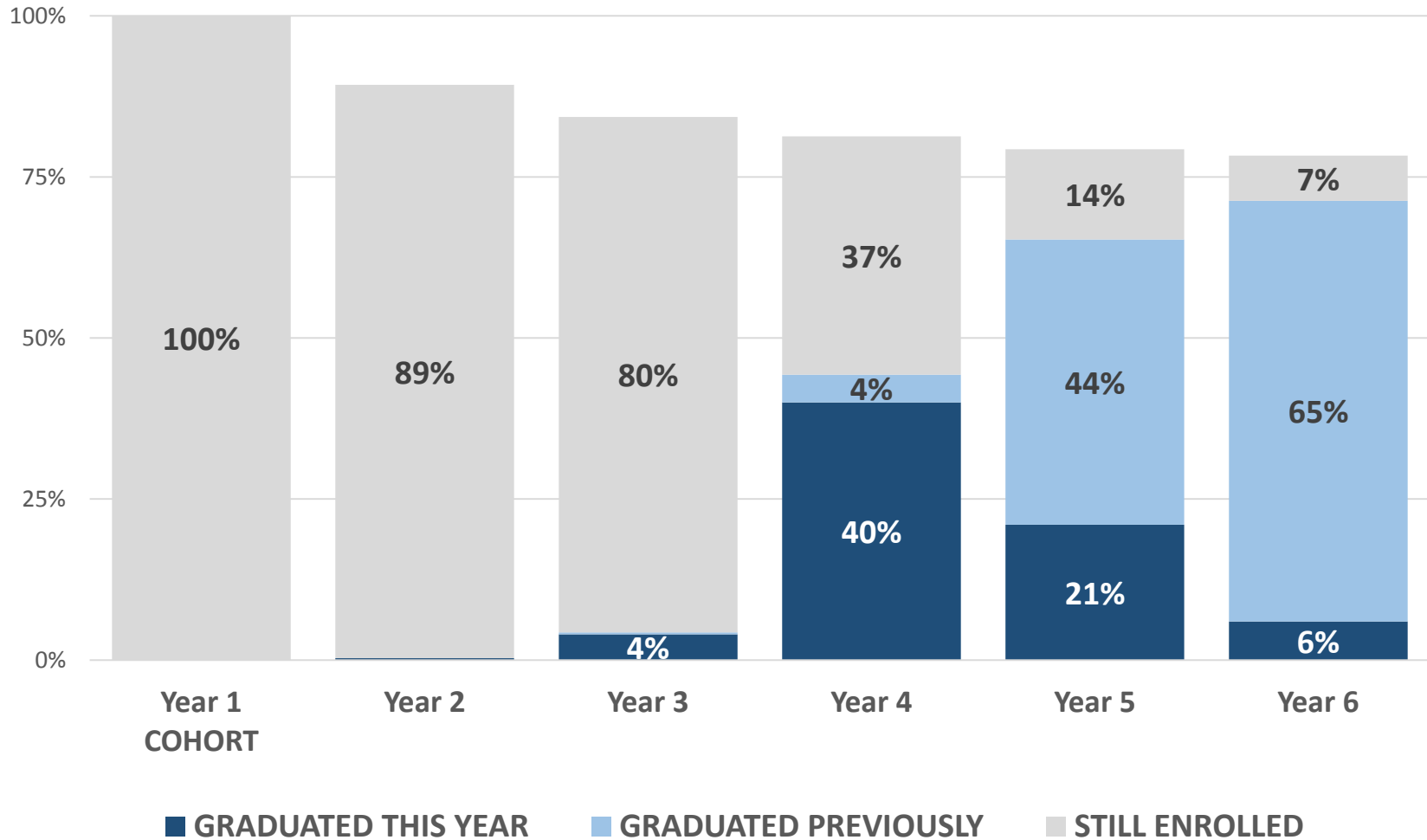

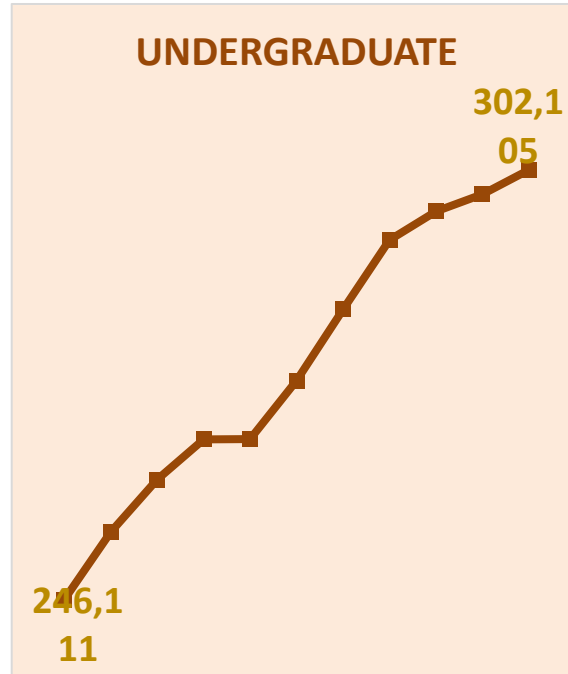


Headcount Enrollment Trends

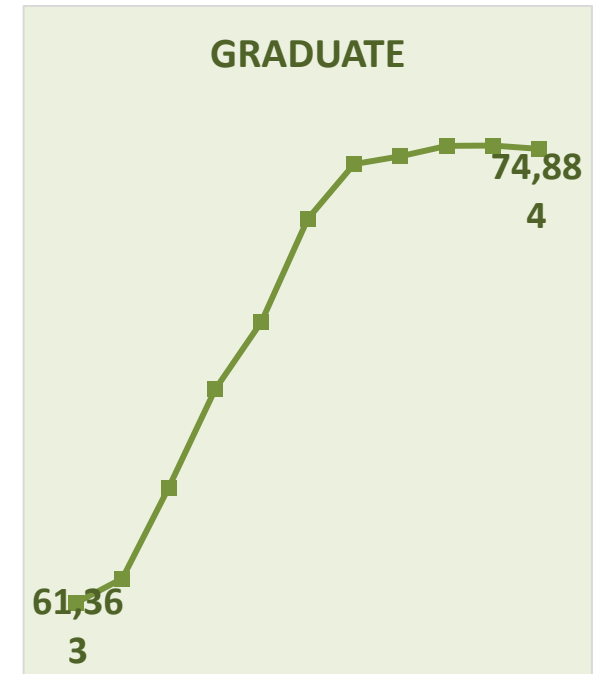
Academic Years 2004-05 through 2014-15

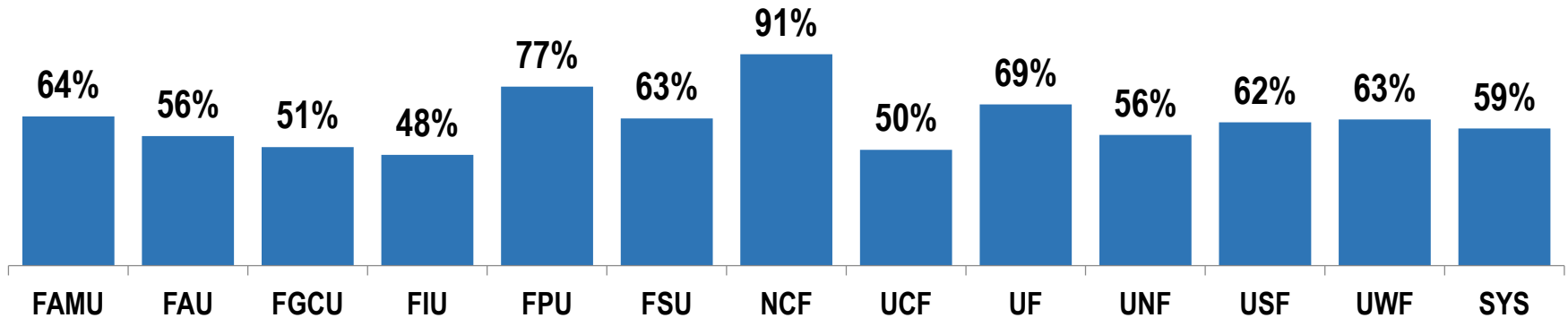

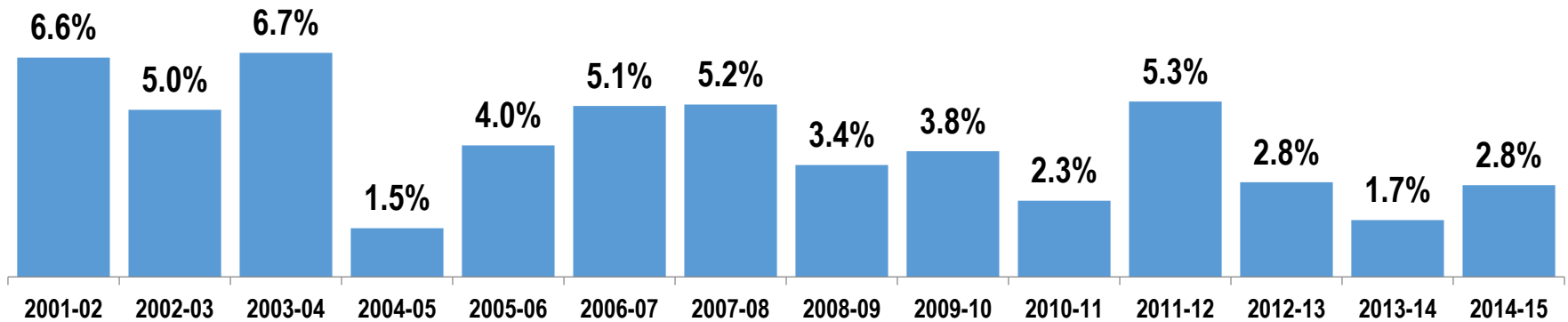

Annual Change in SUS Bachelor's Degrees



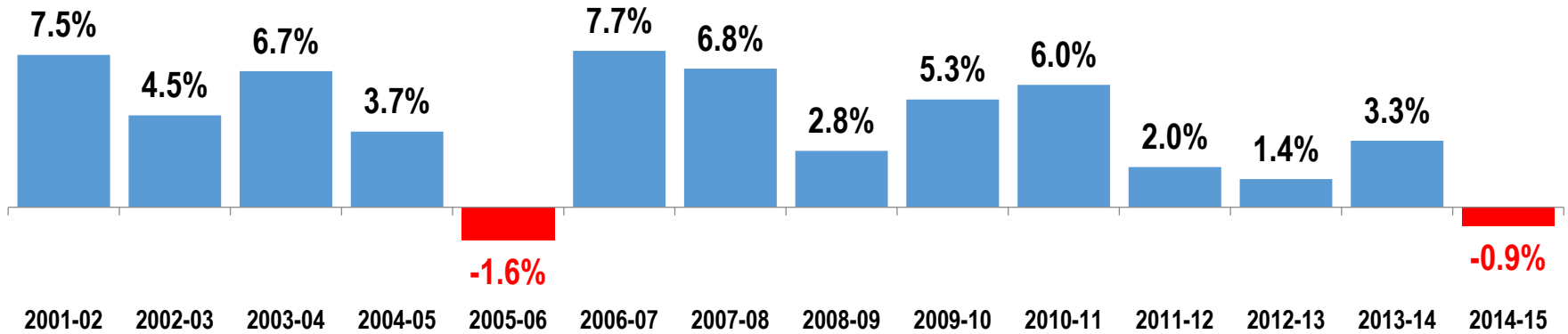

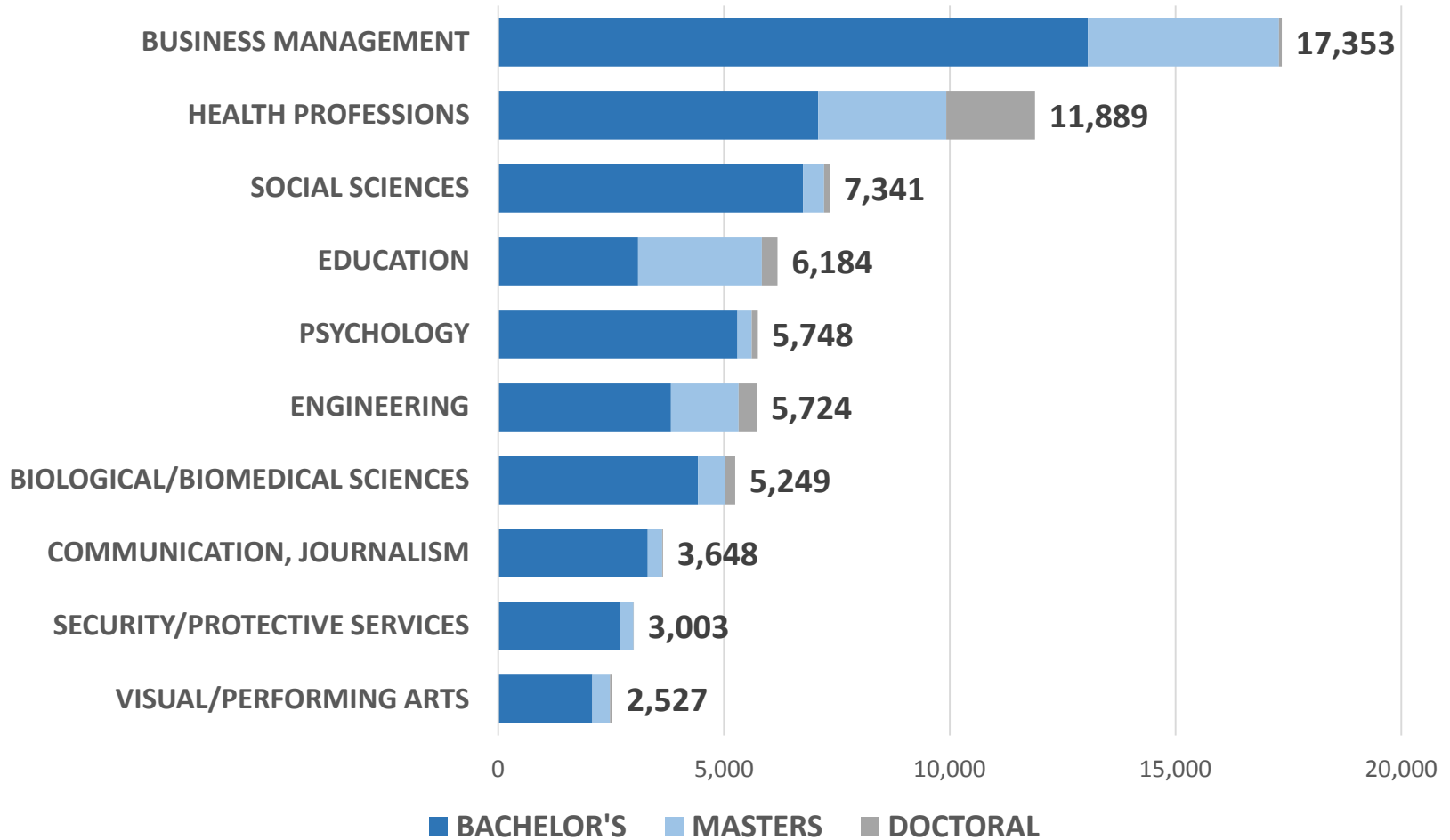
Annual Change in SUS Graduate Degrees
