Full-Time Threshold is the minimum wage multiplied by 40 hours per week multiplied by 13 weeks (this is a quarterly threshold). Full-Time Annualized Wages are calculated by multiplying the Full-Time Threshold by 4. Note*: This report does not include students who continued their education, were employed outside of Florida, entered the military, or were self-employed.
