INTELLECTUAL FREEDOM AND VIEWPOINT DIVERSITY SURVEY

For the State University System of Florida DECEMBER 2024



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Section 1. Background

The 2021 Legislature enacted House Bill 233, which amended section 1001.706, Florida Statutes- Powers and Duties of the Board of Governors, to promote intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity within the State University System of Florida (SUS). Similar language was amended to section 1001.03, Florida Statutes, for the Florida College System (FCS).

Specifically, the legislation created section 1001.73(13), Florida Statutes, entitled INTELLECTUAL FREEDOM AND VIEWPOINT DIVERSITY ASSESSMENT.

This section provides definitions for "intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity" and "shield" and directs the Board of Governors as follows:

(a) For the purposes of this subsection, the term:

1. "Intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity" means the exposure of students, faculty, and staff to, and the encouragement of their exploration of, a variety of ideological and political perspectives.

2. "Shield" means to limit students', faculty members', or staff members' access to, or observation of, ideas and opinions that they may find uncomfortable, unwelcome, disagreeable, or offensive.

(b) The Board of Governors shall require each state university to conduct an annual assessment of the intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity at that institution. The Board of Governors shall select or create an objective, nonpartisan, and statistically valid survey to be used by each state university which considers the extent to which competing ideas and perspectives are presented and members of the university community, including students, faculty, and staff, feel free to express their beliefs and viewpoints on campus and in the classroom. The Board of Governors shall annually compile and publish the assessments by September 1 of each year, beginning on September 1, 2022.
(c) The Board of Governors may not shield students, faculty, or staff at state universities from free speech protected under the First Amendment to the United States Constitution, Art. I of the State Constitution, or s. 1004.97.

Dr. Samuel J. Abrams, Faculty of Politics at Sarah Lawrence College and Senior Fellow at the American Enterprise Institute, worked to develop a survey for all students and a survey for all employees in the SUS and the FCS. The surveys were designed to assess respondents' comfort levels and willingness to share views in a range of settings, including classrooms, at a university event, online, and within non-university social settings

For consistency and a more standardized approach, the Office of the Board of Governors (FLBOG) used a survey platform provided by Alchemer to distribute and collect survey responses.

Section 2. Methodology

The two survey instruments were designed to assess the extent to which students and employees feel free to express their beliefs and viewpoints on campus. For consistency and a more standardized approach, the Universities requested that the Office of the Board of Governors (FLBOG) procure services to disseminate the survey instruments to their student body and employee populations. The Board office used a survey platform provided by Alchemer to distribute and collect survey responses. Alchemy was also contracted to provide managed services to administer the full survey process, including programming, testing, technical configuration, and user technical helpdesk support.

Each institution provided the vendor with the appropriate contact information for their student and staff populations. The student population was designated as all enrolled students after the Spring drop/add period. The staff population was defined as all active employees as of January 3, 2024.

Trends in current survey strategies suggest that for some populations, SMS message delivery can increase response rates. SMS messaging delivery of the survey links 3 were instituted for the student populations. Staff received only email delivery of the survey links.

To improve student response rates and provide more flexibility due to the differing university academic calendars, a 4-week survey period was originally scheduled. Due to the spring break rotation and other factors, the student survey was extended 1 week.

Offering incentives is a proven opinion survey strategy. An incentivized strategy was deployed by the university foundations the week of April 11th of the student survey cycle. A random drawing of five university bookstore \$500 gift cards was offered to enrolled university students. Students had to participate in the survey or register for the drawing with their institution's foundation. Students were notified of the incentive through campus communications and within the remaining survey notifications.

Incentives were not provided for the staff survey.

The survey was administered per the schedules listed in Tables 1 and 2.

*Unique Survey one time use links were delivered to both students and staff.

A vendor, ResponsiveMR (a subsidiary of Radius), was contracted to statistically weight the response data. Aggregate institutional student and staff demographics were provided to the vendor to perform the statistical weighting.

Weighting involves 3 basic steps:

- 1. Identify the <u>Target Distribution</u>. This was information provided to ResponsiveMR by FL State University System with information about employment and enrollment numbers for each university.
- 2. Identify the <u>Sample Distribution</u>. These numbers come directly from survey response data, detailing the number of respondents in each of our demographic categories that completed the survey.
- 3. Estimate the proportion by which each distribution is over/under-estimated in our Sample compared to the Target. This deviation provides information about the amount by which each demographic group must be weighted up/down in order for our Sample Distribution to match our Target Distribution.

Once these proportions are estimated and the weights calculated, we do two QA steps. First, we compared our <u>Weighted Sample Distributions</u> to our <u>Target</u> <u>Distributions</u> to ensure that they match. This is not always a perfect match, as our sample data always has some respondents who completed the survey but refused to answer one or more questions. Second, we inspect the weighting values to make sure that none are out of acceptable ranges. Acceptable ranges for weights are generally considered between 0.2 and 5. If any weights are outside this range, those values are calibrated back to within the acceptable range. This process can also create some minor deviations between our <u>Weighted Sample</u> and <u>Target</u> <u>Distributions</u>.

In total, 48,132 students and 11,989 employees responded to the survey but only 31,309 students and 8,045 employees completed it. Only complete responses are used for weighting and only complete responses are used in the analysis of survey results.

Section 3. Student Survey Responses

Table 3.1 student response rates by university.

The most frequent method of distribution was via student email. A link to the student survey was delivered to more than 338,000 students, and there were 49,132 responses, representing a 14.5% response rate. The range of institutional response rates varied from 9.6% to 38.9%.




Figure 3.1. Question 1 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.1 summarizes the responses to the question, "Considering all the time at your current college or university, have your courses been:" 52% of respondents identified that their coursework is in-person, while 20.7% of respondents have coursework that is online. There were .1% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.2. Question 2 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.2 summarizes the responses to the question, "I feel that it is important to be able to express my political viewpoints without fear of negative consequences." 92.5% of respondents agreed that it is important to be able to express political viewpoints without fear of negative consequences, while 7.3% of respondents disagreed. There were .2% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.3. Question 3 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.3 summarizes the responses to the question, "If you had to choose, is it more important for colleges or universities:" 37.8% of respondents agreed that it is more important to prohibit offensive speech on campus that is biased against certain groups. While 61.6% of respondents agreed that it is more important to expose students to all types of viewpoints, even if they are offensive or biased against certain groups. There were .5% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.4. Question 4 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.4 summarizes the responses to the question, "Which of the following statements comes closer to your own personal opinion?" 7.7% of respondents agreed that speech is violence and should be treated as such by the university. 91.6% of respondents agreed that it is important for a healthy campus life that the distinctions between speech and violence are maintained. There were .7% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.5. Question 5 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.5 summarizes the responses to the question, "Which of the following two statements comes closer to your own opinion?" 35.8% of respondents agreed political correctness helps people avoid offending others. 63.3% of respondents agreed that political correctness has silenced important discussions our society needs to have. There were .9% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.6. Question 6 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.6 summarizes the responses to the question, "My college or university campus provides an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs." 80.9% of respondents agreed that their campus provides an environment for free expression of ideas, opinions, and beliefs, while 18.5% of respondents disagreed. There were .6% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.7. Question 7 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.7 summarizes the responses to the question, "I see examples of free and welcomed expression (such as speeches, debates with other students or instructors, class assignments, etc.) in my classes regularly." 73.6% of respondents who agreed that they see examples of free and welcomed expression in classes regularly, while 25.5% disagreed. There were .9% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.8. Question 8 Student Responses (*n* = 31,309)

Figure 3.8 summarizes the responses to the question, "My professors or course instructors use class time to express their own social or political beliefs without objectively discussing opposing social or political beliefs." 29.9% of respondents who agreed that their professors or course instructors use class time to express their own beliefs without objectively discussing opposing social or political beliefs, while 69% disagreed. There were 1.1% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.9. Question 9 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.9 summarizes the responses to the question, "If you agree or strongly agree that your instructors use class time to express their own beliefs, indicate the ideas and beliefs that are more prevalent." 18.7% of respondents who indicated that liberal beliefs were more prevalent, while 7.7% indicated that conservative beliefs were more prevalent. There were 3.4% who selected other and 70.2% of participants did not respond to this question.




Figure 3.10. Question 10 Student Responses (*n* = 31,309)

Figure 3.10 summarizes the responses to the question, "Students at my college or university are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives." 78.2% of respondents who agreed that they are encouraged to consider a wide variety of viewpoints and perspectives, while 21.1% of respondents disagreed. There were .8% participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.11. Question 11 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.11 summarizes the responses to the question, "I feel comfortable speaking up and giving my views on noncontroversial topics." 84% of respondents who agreed that they feel comfortable giving their views on non-controversial topics, while 15.2% disagreed. There were .8% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.12. Question 12 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.12 summarizes the responses to the question, "I feel comfortable speaking up and giving my views on controversial topics." 58.9% of respondents who agreed that they feel comfortable giving their views on controversial topics, while 40.3% disagreed. There were .7% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.13. Question 13 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.13 summarizes the responses to the question, "On your campus, how often have you felt that you could not express your opinion on a subject because of how students, a professor, or the administration would respond?" 17.8% of respondents said they often felt that they could not express their opinions on a subject, while 52.4% said they rarely/never felt that. There were .7% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.14. Question 14 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.14 summarizes the responses to the question, "How often have you not spoken up on campus because you thought your opinion would be unwelcome?" 61.4% of respondents feel they have not spoken up, while 37.8% spoke up. There were .9% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.15. Question 15 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.15 summarizes the responses to the question, "My college or university is doing a good job when it comes to promoting or encouraging diverse political viewpoints." 68.8% of respondents agreed that their university is doing a good job promoting or encouraging diverse political viewpoints, while 30.1% disagreed. There were 1.1% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.16. Question 16 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.16 summarizes the responses to the question, "I would be concerned if most of my professors or course instructors held the same political beliefs." 59.2% of respondents agreed that they would be concerned if most of their professors or course instructors held the same political beliefs, while 39.7% disagreed. There were 1.1% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.17. Question 17 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.17 summarizes the responses to the question, "I have felt intimidated to share my ideas or political opinions because they were different from those of my professors." 29.8% of respondents agreed that they have felt intimidated to share their ideas or political beliefs because they were different than those of their professors, while 69.2% disagreed. There were 1% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.18. Question 18 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.18 summarizes the responses to the question, "My professors or course instructors are generally more: conservative, liberal, other, don't know." 36.6% of respondents indicated that they believed their instructors to be generally more liberal, while 5.8% believed their instructors to be more conservative. 54.1% of respondents indicated that they did not know the political beliefs of their instructors. There were 2.8% who chose other and .7% of participants decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.19. Question 19 Student Responses (n = 31,309)

Figure 3.19 summarizes the responses to the question, "If a controversy over offensive speech were to occur on your campus, how likely is it that the administration would defend the speaker's right to express their views?" 21.3% of respondents indicated it is likely that the administration would defend the speaker's right to express their views, while 21.5% believed it is not likely. There were .6% who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.20. Question 20 Student Responses (*n* = 31,309)

There were 1% of participants who decided not to provide a response to this question.




Figure 3.21. Question 21 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.22. Question 22 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.23. Question 23 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.24. Question 24 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.25. Question 25 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.26. Question 26 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.27. Question 27 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.28. Question 28 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.29. Question 29 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.30. Question 30 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.31. Question 31 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.32. Question 32 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.34. Question 34 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.35. Question 35 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.36. Question 36 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.37. Question 37 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.38. Question 38 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.39. Question 39 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.40. Question 40 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.41. Question 41 Student Responses (*n* = 31,309)




Figure 3.42. Question 42 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.43. Question 43 Student Responses (*n* = 31,309)




Figure 3.44. Question 44 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.45. Question 45 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.46. Question 46 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.47. Question 47 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.48. Question 48 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.49. Question 49 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.50. Question 50 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.51. Question 51 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.52. Question 52 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 3.53. Question 53 Student Responses (n = 31,309)




Figure 4.2. Question 2 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.3. Question 3 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.4. Question 4 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.5. Question 5 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.6. Question 6 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.7. Question 7 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.8. Question 8 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.9. Question 9 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.10. Question 10 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.11. Question 11 Employee *Responses (n = 8,045)*




Figure 4.12. Question 12 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.13. Question 13 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.14. Question 14 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.15. Question 15 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.16. Question 16 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.17. Question 17 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.18. Question 18 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.19. Question 19 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.20. Question 20 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.21. Question 21 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.22. Question 22 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.23. Question 23 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.24. Question 24 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.25. Question 25 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.26. Question 26 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.27. Question 27 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.28. Question 28 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.29. Question 29 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.30. Question 30 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.31. Question 31 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.32. Question 32 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.33. Question 33 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.34. Question 34 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.35. Question 35 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.36. Question 36 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.37. Question 37 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.38. Question 38 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.39. Question 39 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.40. Question 40 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.41. Question 41 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.42. Question 42 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.43. Question 43 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.44. Question 44 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.45. Question 45 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.46. Question 46 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.47. Question 47 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.48. Question 48 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.49. Question 49 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.50. Question 50 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.51. Question 51 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.52. Question 52 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.53. Question 53 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.54. Question 54 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.55. Question 55 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.56. Question 56 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.57. Question 57 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.58. Question 58 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.59. Question 59 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.60. Question 60 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)




Figure 4.61. Question 61 Employee Responses (*n* = 8,045)




Figure 4.62. *Question 62 Employee Responses (n = 8,045)*
