Consequences of Drug Use Among College **Students**

- Short-term effect of drug use
 - Reduced capacity for learning
 - **Memory loss**
 - Fall behind academically, lower GPA
 - Impaired perceptual motor skills
 - More likely to engage in risky sexual behavior
 - Impulsive behaviors
- Long-term effect of drug use
 - Treatment Needs
 - Legal record
 - Death

Factors & Influences of Drug Use Among College Students

- Likelihood increased by
 - History of drug use in middle/high school
 - Peer pressure & perceived use among peers
 - **Escape & avoidance**
 - Genetics (abuse), family history
 - Greek & athletic membership, freshmen

Factors & Influences of Drug Use Among College **Students**

- Likelihood decreased by
 - Parental concerns & expectations
 - **Campus & community involvement**
 - **Health education**
 - Accurate & perceived drug use
 - **Engagement in spiritual & religious practices**

18-25 Year Olds Substance Abuse Disorders

Substance Abuse Disorder is a clinically significant impairment caused by the recurrent use of alcohol, drugs, or both. Impairments include health problems, disabilities, & failure to meet major responsibilities at work, home, or school.

- > 5% with disorder due to recurrent Marijuana use (1.7 million)
- > 1% with disorder due to recurrent Opioid use (392,000)
- > Less than 1% had a disorder due to recurrent use of:
 - Pain Reliever
 - Cocaine
 - Tranquilizer
 - Stimulant
 - Heroin
 - Methamphetamine

18-25 Year Olds Opioid Use

- > 7% of people ages 18 to 25, currently misuse Opioids
 - Prescription pain killers are the most commonly misused type of Opioid
 - <1% use Heroin</p>





Reasons for Misuse






SUS Students PERCEIVED Drug Use






College Students ACTUAL Drug Use

Impact of Drug Use on College Students




- > 1% reported being diagnosed and/or treated for substance abuse (drugs & alcohol) within last 12 months [SUS students & all college students]
- > 1-2% reported that drug use interfered with academic performance within last 12 months [SUS students & all college students]
 - Examples: lower exam grade, lower course grade, unable to complete course

- Drug use & misuse is relatively low among SUS students (<5%), with the exception of marijuana
 - Proportion of SUS students using marijuana (18%) is <u>lower</u> than the proportion of all college students (20%) & the proportion of all 18-25 year olds nationwide (21%) using marijuana
- Students perceive that their peers use drugs more than they actually do
- Consequences of prolonged & excessive use
 - > 1-2% reported academic impact
 - 1% diagnosed and/or treated for substance (drug/alcohol) abuse or addiction
