Florida Statutes 1001.93

Offices of Public Policy Events within the State University System



Florida Statutes 1001.93 requires each state university within the SUS to establish an Office of Public Policy Events and appoint a Director of Public Policy Events

Universities are required to:

- Host two events during the fall semester and two events during the spring semester representing a diversity of perspectives
- Speakers and presenters can be selected from within the state university community or invited in to present a different perspective
